- Cary Whitesell reported that the Tree Giveaway will be March 19, 2022 through the Tennessee environmental Council. Andrea Warf reported that Oak Grove Elementary School
- Cary Whitesell reported that there may possibly funding through the Tn Dept. of Ag for trees and pollinator garden
- We are looking for funding for trailhead signage
- Barbara Woods is going to ask Stacey Cothran with Waste Management if they could donate replacement garbage and recycling cans along the greenway that have been damaged throughout construction
- Need to start making a plan to replace ash trees that are dying due to the Emerald ash bore
 - Recommend that we replace these with something smaller and could be a good Arbor Day project
 Will need to go in front of council to ask for funding
- Arbor Day will be the first Friday in March, 2022, we can possibly move our celebration in coordination with the tree distribution on March 19, 2022. The observation will be our Spring Meeting.
- Meeting with Waste Management about the 373 project- planting of colorful fall and summer trees got cancelled. However, the theory is still that Waste Management will fund this project.
